

Infected Wounds, Cat Bites and Slivers

I am not a medical doctor, so this is only for information and education. I am not responsible if you try it and it doesn't work.

I got this out of an old book that was printed in the 1940's or 1950's. They said it was a remedy for bed sore. I have never had bed sores or known anyone who did so I don't know if it works for that.

I once spent 2 hours in a hospital outpatient room as they gave me IV for a cat bite or should I say multiple cat bites? I once had a cat that lived in his own world and would attack people or animals he did not like. I was holding him one day when a strange dog entered the room and my cat wanted to then attack my friend's child, so I held on to my cat for dear life and believe it or not the cat did not get away but my hands both looked like they went through a meat grinder. The cat both bit me several times and scratched me several times. Cats have something in their saliva which causes severe infection so that is why I ended up getting 2 hours' worth of antibiotics in an IV at a hospital.

Then later I adopted a cat from the local animal shelter named Genji. She was a pure white Turkish Angora with a personality that was such that she would bite me without notice. So, I tried this on my bites from her which one of the bites she gave me did get infected before I used this remedy.

On a small plate I mixed some real white granulated sugar and some dish soap together to make a paste then I put it on a piece of gauze and wrapped it with a piece of plastic and taped it so it was airtight. That is it. I left it on for about 3 days and my infection was totally gone from the cat bite.

I have also used it to draw out slivers, large or small and any kind of a skin wound that becomes infected. All the times I have done this it has only taken 1 to 3 days to force the sliver out or cure the infection in the wound. I have used this method for years with no side effects at all.

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
